


# Winter Weather Advisory Tonight Through Early Tue























- Snow will move in late tonight and persist into late Monday night
- Graphic above shows forecast total accumulations through early Tuesday
- Monday AM/PM commutes and Tue AM commute likely to be impacted in many areas
- Wind chills of 0 to 20 below early this morning and to 10 below Mon AM

### **Important Forecast Changes**




Slight increase to forecast snowfall amounts.


Winter Weather Advisory has been expanded slightly to the west. Start time of winter weather advisory moved a few hours earlier tonight.

## **Forecast Timeline**




- Any change in the track of the system could cause a shift in the highest accumulations

#### Winter Weather Quick Facts and Preparedness:



#### Quick facts you should know about winter weather:

- As little as 1/16" of ice can begin to impact roadways and sidewalks.
- 70% of snow and ice related injuries occur in automobiles. Leave extra space between you and the vehicle in front of you. Take it slow on ice and snow.

#### Preparedness:

- A Winter Storm Watch is issued when conditions are favorable for significant winter weather. Time to prepare!
- A **Winter Storm Warning** is issued when a combination of heavy snow, blowing snow, and possibly ice mixed with snow is expected to impact the area. *Time to act!*
- A Winter Weather Advisory is issued when conditions will cause travel difficulties and other minor impacts. Use caution.
