




Snow Tonight; Hard Freeze Wed AM & Thu AM

- Reduced visibilities, and some potential for slushy snow accumulations on the roads, may create difficult travel conditions late aftn into tonight.
- The snow ends from west to east late this Evening into early Wed AM.

Important Forecast Changes

NEW Winter Weather Advisories in effect from 7 PM – 7 AM for NE Indiana and NW Ohio, and Hillsdale MI where accumulations of 3-6" are possible, and freezing temperatures overnight could cause icy driving conditions.


Key Points

Hazards, Timing and Duration: Accumulating snow and reduced visibilities developing Tuesday afternoon and continuing through early Wednesday morning. Below freezing temperatures Wednesday morning and Thursday morning.


Areas Impacted: For snow, areas mainly along/north of US 24 Tuesday afternoon, shifting southeast into areas south of US 24 Tuesday evening. For frost, the entire area each night.


Impacts: Slippery and slushy road conditions possible due to snow, and then freezing roadways, mainly Tuesday night. This may impact the Tuesday PM and Wednesday AM commutes. The widespread freeze Tuesday night and Wednesday night will kill sensitive outdoor vegetation if not brought inside.

Estimated End Time of Snow late Tue/early Wed





Winter Weather Quick Facts and Preparedness:



Quick facts you should know about winter weather:

- As little as 1/16" of ice can begin to impact roadways and sidewalks.
- 70% of snow and ice related injuries occur in automobiles. Leave extra space between you and the vehicle in front of you. Take it slow on ice and snow.

Preparedness:

- A **Winter Storm Watch** is issued when conditions are favorable for significant winter weather. *Time to prepare!*
- A **Winter Storm Warning** is issued when a combination of heavy snow, blowing snow, and possibly ice mixed with snow is expected to impact the area. *Time to act!*
- A **Winter Weather Advisory** is issued when conditions will cause travel difficulties and other minor impacts. Use caution.
