

# **High Heat/Humidity**

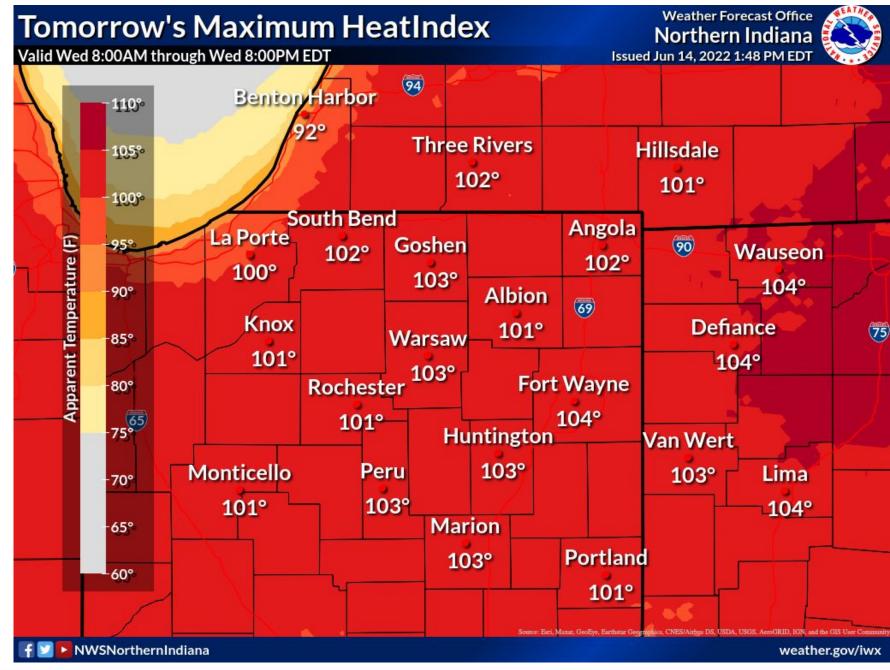
Wednesday

#### **Overview**

- → Excessive heat and high humidity will continue on Wednesday 6/15. An Excessive Heat Warning remains in effect through Wednesday evening.
- → Existing power outages from Monday night's storms may increase impacts.
- → High heat index values of 100 to 110 degrees. Little relief at night. Cooler by Lake Michigan.
- → Confidence is high.
- → Outdoor activity should be minimized and air conditioned shelter should be used, drink plenty of fluids, and watch for signs of heat exhaustion/heat stroke

### **Confidence: Heat Impacts Tue**

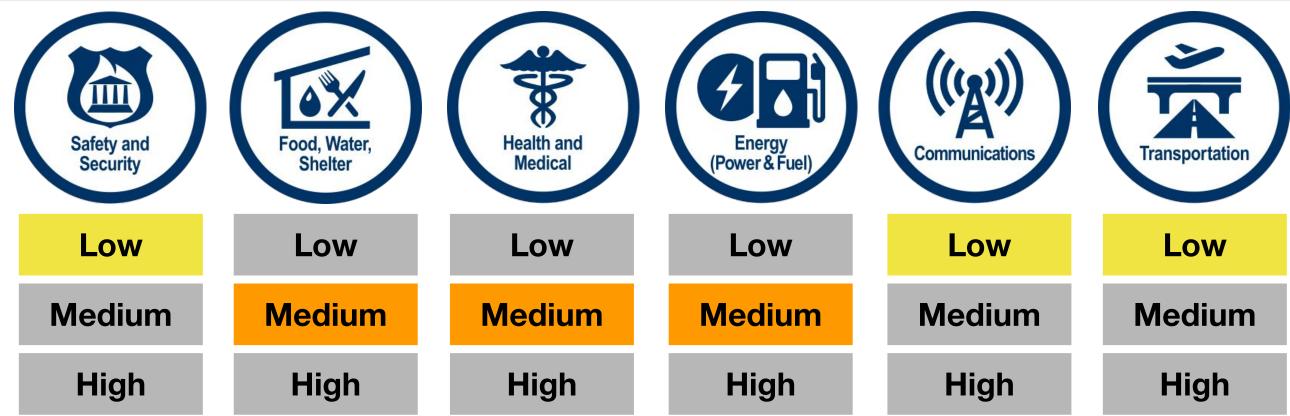








### **Potential Impacts**



## **Key Messages**

- → Health and Medical Medium Potential for increased patient flow due to heat illnesses especially with existing power outages from Monday's storms
- → Energy Medium Due to existing power outages from Monday night's storms and extra usage today and Wednesday due to high heat
- → Food, Water, Shelter Medium Potential need for cooling centers and water distribution especially with existing power outages from Monday's storms
- → Transportation & Communication Low
