Severe Storms Possible Later Tonight, Wednesday, and Thursday

Key Messages

- Storms could develop late this afternoon/evening, with additional development overnight into Wednesday morning
- Forecast confidence is low to medium for severe weather tonight. Exact timing & severity is still somewhat unclear.
- Additional severe weather is possible Wednesday and Thursday but confidence is low for both days.
- Heavy rain/flooding and damaging winds will be the main threats for each round of possible severe weather.

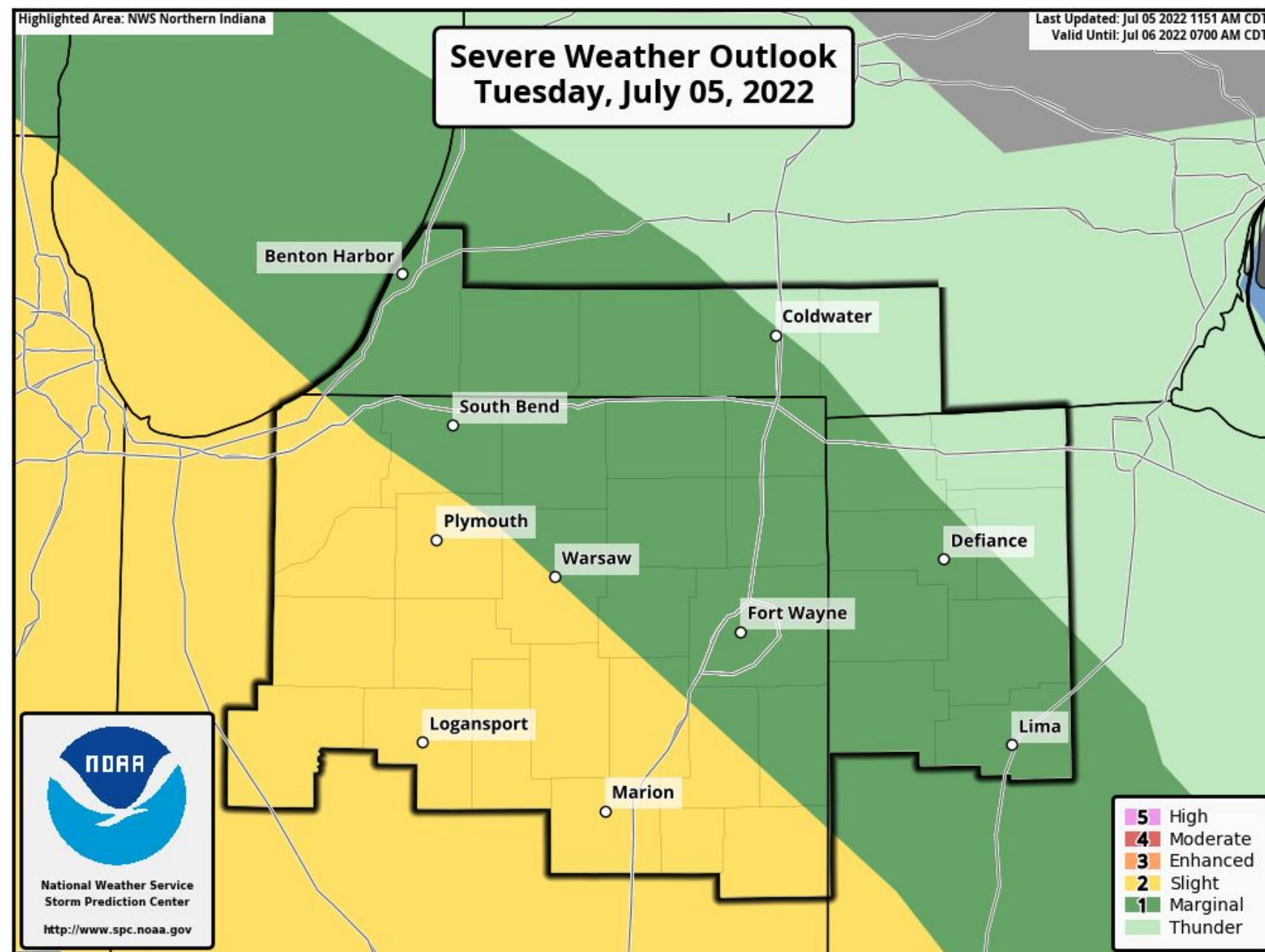

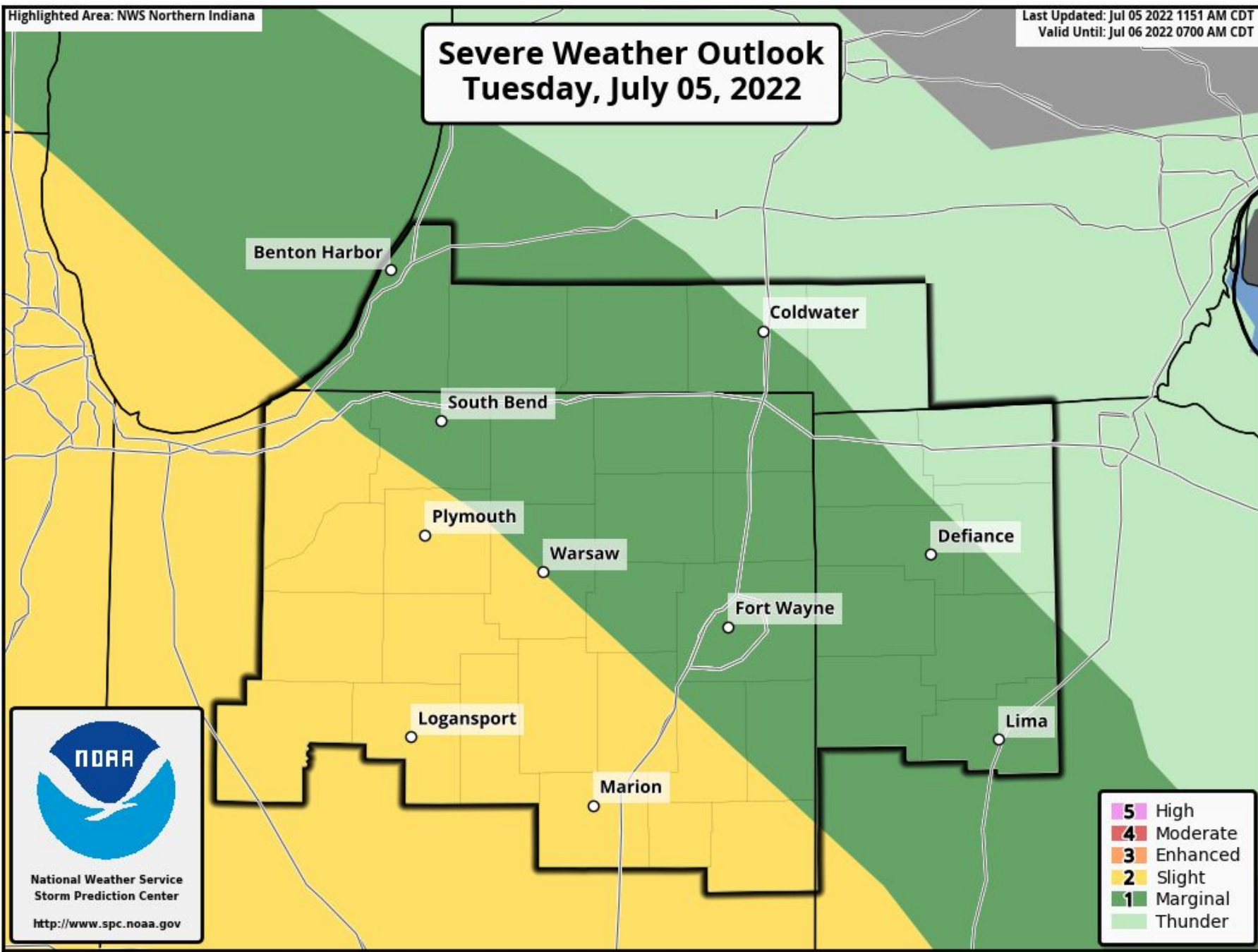
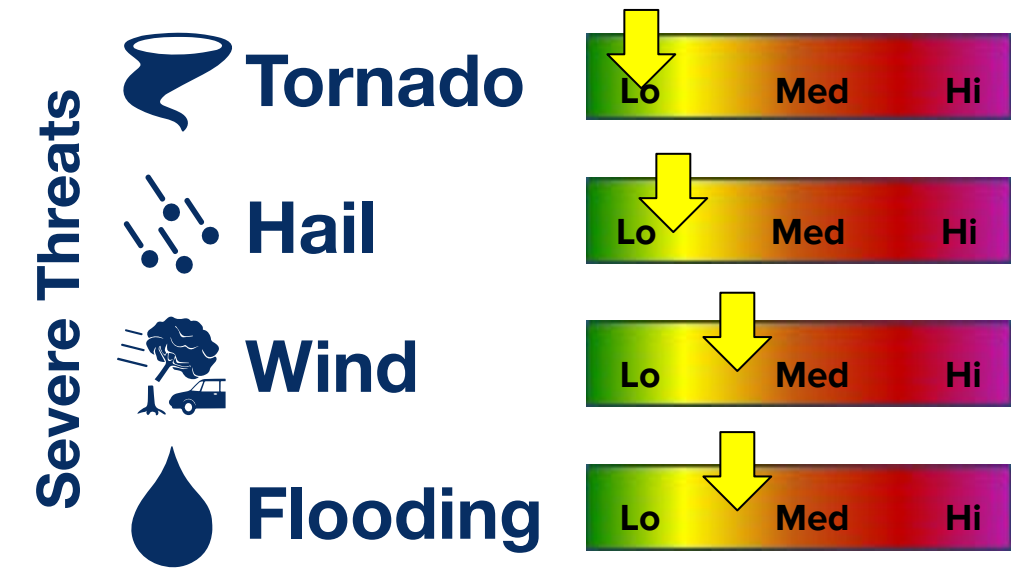
Round 1: Later Today

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Timing & Threats

Timing/Location/Confidence

- Storms could develop late this afternoon/evening between 4-9 PM ET, with additional development overnight
- Low to medium confidence in storm development, timing, and severity.
- Primary hazards include heavy rain, flooding, and damaging wind gusts.





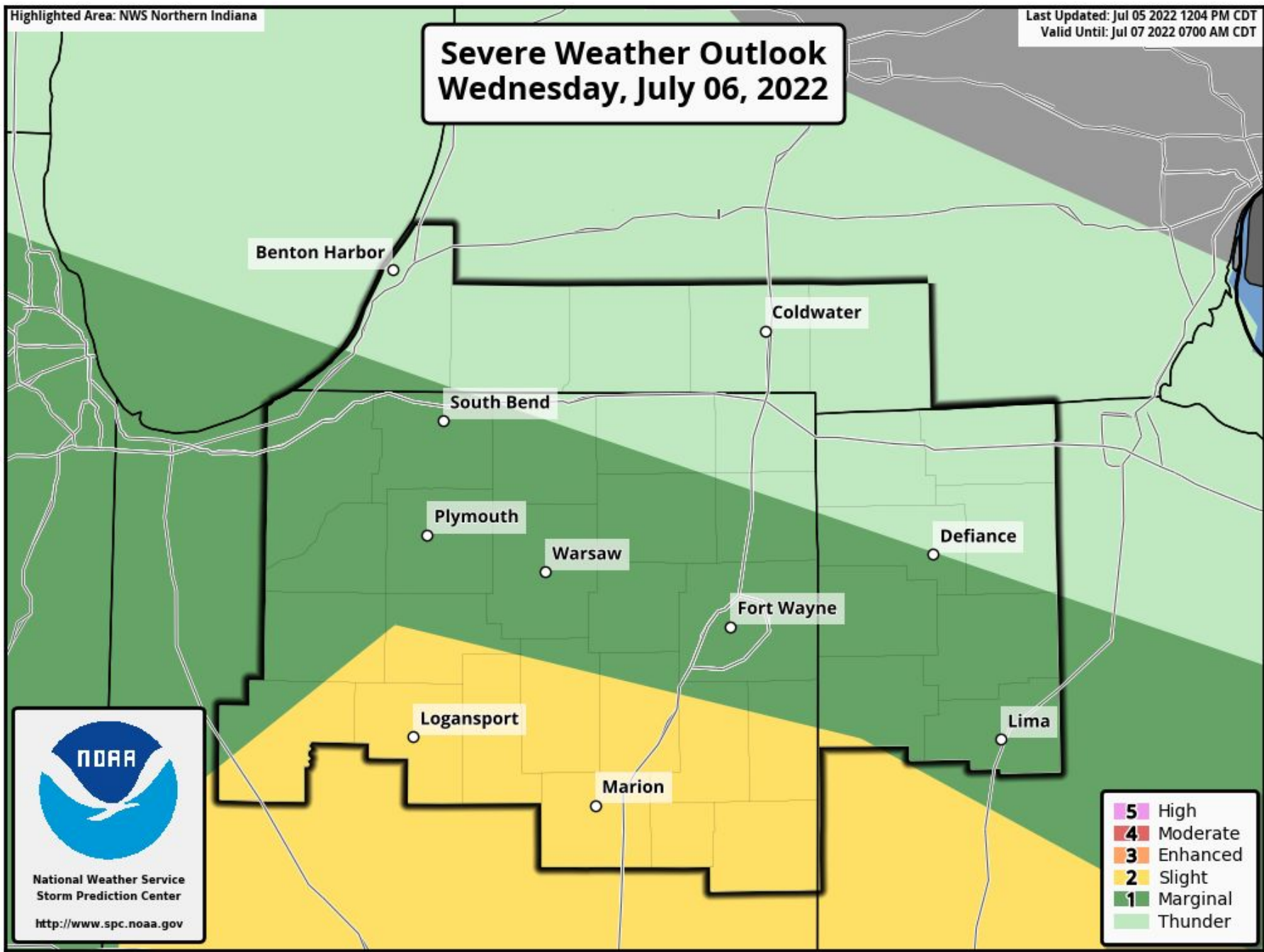
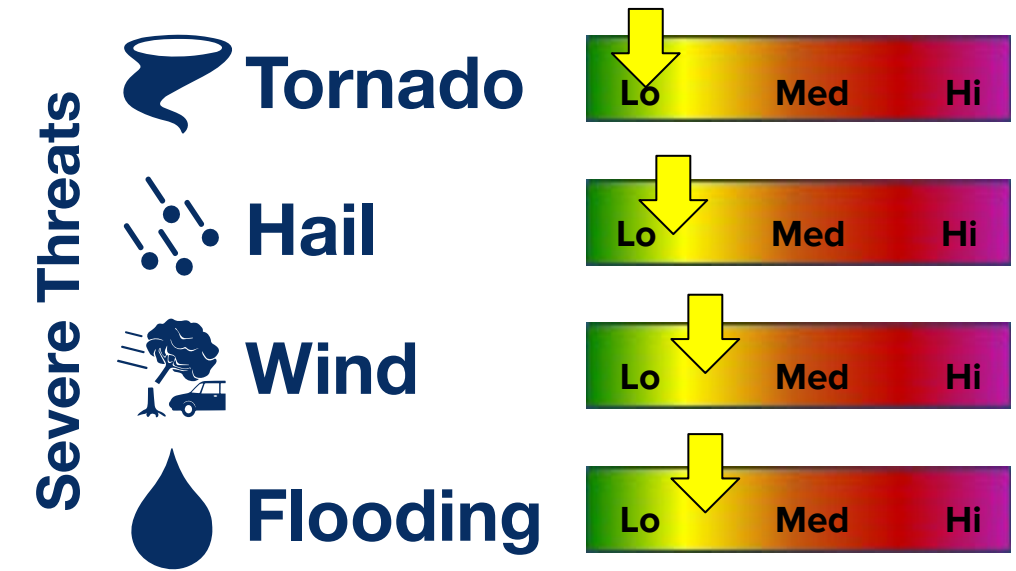
Round 2: Late Wednesday?

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Timing & Threats

Timing/Location/Confidence

- Severe storms are possible again Wednesday afternoon and evening.
- Best chance of severe weather is south of US-30.
- Confidence remains low.





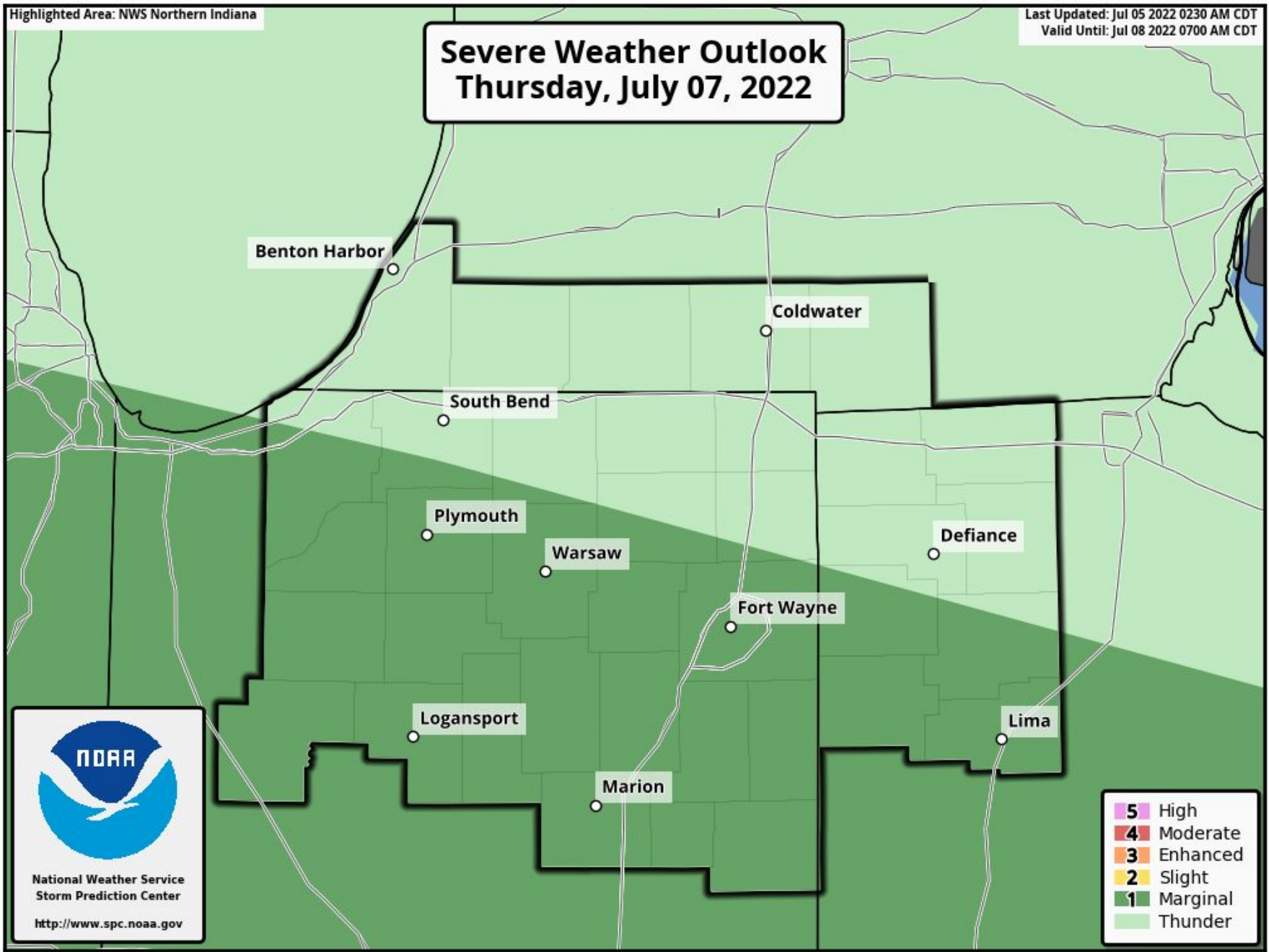
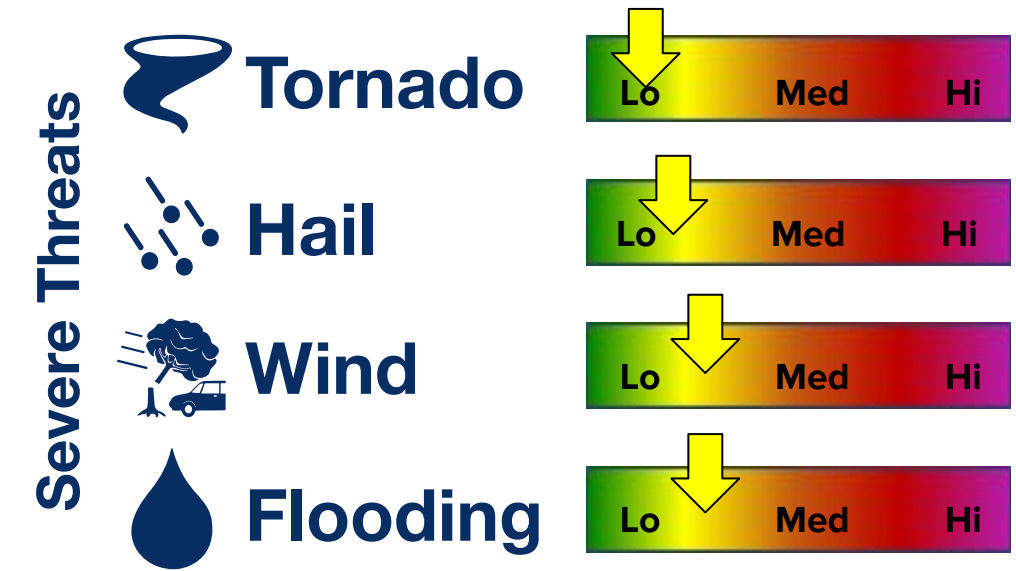
Round 3: Thursday?

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Timing & Threats

Timing/Location/Confidence

- Severe storms are possible again on Thursday.
- Confidence is low on timing and threats.
- Best chances for severe weather would be south of US-6.



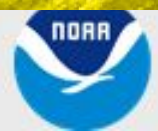
SLIGHT RISK

Scattered severe storms possible.

Short-lived and not widespread -- isolated intense storms possible.

Plan ahead if you have outdoor plans and have a way to get NWS warnings.
