



# HOLIDAY Test

### Jolly Holidays

During the holiday season, downtown Fort Wayne is always full of holiday cheer.

No fewer than 450 tons of holiday cheer are trucked in from arctic holiday cheer mines for the festivities, I believe.

Just teasing.

We have all the holiday cheer we need in Fort Wayne, thank you very much, without having to procure any from elsewhere.

Night of Lights on November 26 kicks off HolidayFest, more than four weeks of holiday happenings downtown, and it is a chance for longtime residents to recapture parts of their childhoods and for new residents and nonresidents to recapture the sense that their childhoods weren't as good as the childhoods of people who grew up in Fort Wayne. So, they have to make up for lost time.

And they do. They always do.

Night of Lights features a succession of light display debuts plus previews of events, exhibits, extravaganzas and other spectacles in the downtown area.

Some things stay reassuringly the same and some things change in a thrilling manner.

There will be several new wrinkles this year at the History Center.

Executive director Todd Maxwell Pelfrey said that the History Center will be celebrating its 40th anniversary.

A 40th anniversary triggers a ruby jubilee within some monarchies...and in some history centers, apparently.

So, there will be a special category this year in the Festival of Gingerbread for rubyhued houses. There will also be a temporary exhibit on the Three Rivers Festival and new LED lights in the turret.

"They should be a generation improved from the original LED lights that we installed in 2010," he said. "They should look even more spectacular than those that we've shared for the past 15 years, and we will be the first to flip the switch on the 26th."

Another must-see event for many revelers of the Christmas persuasion is the Embassy Theatre's Festival of Trees.

Where the Festival of Trees is concerned, Fort Wayne residents are divided into two groups: Residents who wouldn't be able to live with themselves if they didn't visit the Festival of Trees at least once annually and residents who wouldn't be able to live with themselves if they didn't visit the Festival of Trees at least once annually DURING NIGHT OF LIGHTS.

There are no other kinds of residents.

I asked Carly Myers, chief marketing officer for the Embassy, to reveal top-secret details about the event that no one could possibly know unless they visited the Embassy website where the information is laid out in a clear and pleasing manner.

For one thing, the hours on November 26

have been expanded.

Usually, it is open from 6 pm to 9 pm. But this year, it is open from 3 pm to 9 pm.

This gives people a chance to visit the trees before the lightings start. After the lightings start, all is bedlam. Polite, orderly, cordial and delightful bedlam, yes. But bedlam all the same.

There will be a Sensory Friendly Sunday this year (Nov. 30), featuring sensory friendly hours for the Festival of Trees and a sensory friendly Breakfast with Santa.

"We will have a new ornament this year for purchase as well," Myers wrote in an email. "Last year, we did a limited-edition Blade ornament. This year, it will highlight our Grande Page pipe organ."

She means the Embassy's blade sign, not Blade, the vampire. I had to use Google search to determine whether someone, somewhere offers a Blade the Vampire Christmas ornament. Someone, somewhere

does, of course. Someone, somewhere offers almost anything. But (addressing the most obvious question in readers' minds) does someone, somewhere offer an ornament depicting Blade, the vampire, dressed as Hermey, the elf? Someone, somewhere does not. Yet.

Parkview Field's new Holiday Lights event will already have been open nearly two weeks by the time Night of Lights rolls around.


This event made a bigger splash last year than anyone predicted. Anyone but Mike Nutter, president of the Fort Wayne TinCaps, that is.

Here's what Nutter said about this year's event.

"Tons of new stuff! We're going from 1,000,000 lights to 1,500,000 lights! We'll be up by ½ million! But we're keeping prices the exact same. There will be all new music and all new displays across the entire playing field."

### A Good Run!

There are many races and runs in the region year round, but there is something special about the Galloping Gobbler. The Galloping Gobbler, which is roughly 25 years old, was founded by lawyer, former city councilman and former state rep Mitch Harper because there weren't any Thanksgiving Day races within easy reach a quarter of a century ago. Harper said he was inspired by an Ohio race that went through a cemetery (The Galloping Gobbler goes through Lindenwood). There are probably people who find that feature a little daunting, but

Harper said Lindenwood is part of the Rural Cemetery Movement, which promoted the idea that cemeteries should be pleasant places in which to spend time. "These were designed to be places where people would gather under trees," he said. "They would take the carriage out, would have a picnic. They're designed for the living, as opposed to the churchyard cemeteries."

Another unusual feature of the Galloping Gobbler is the main prize: Bread. Harper said he was in a bakery the first year of the race and he happened upon some visually striking loaves of bread. "You

could have set them as a centerpiece at your Thanksgiving table," he said. "It was one of those you'd use in a Good Housekeeping shot. Or, you know, Gourmet Magazine. Unbelievably beautiful." He decided to give these loaves as prizes and the tradition took on a life of its own. "This became a big trophy," he said. "There are bragging rights involved." COVID-19 and the difficulty of finding a provider meant that the bread tradition went away for a few years, but it will return this Thanksgiving.

Perhaps the most unusual and profound feature of the race is



how the runners see it.
Runners view it much
more as a gathering of old
friends and a cherished
family tradition than a
standard competition.
Harper recalls a year
that some runners were
stopped by a train. When
he apologized to one of
them, this runner did not
react the way he thought
he would. "He looked at
me and kind of had a

grin on his face after I apologized," Harper said.
"And he said, 'There's no need to do that...You don't understand your own race....This isn't a race like other races. This is more like a reunion.' And that was a pretty powerful thing, because it was true, and it's something I'd intended, but I hadn't articulated that."

Fort Wayne's gateway to the holiday season, "Christmas On Broadway," will take place this year on Friday, November 21, 2025, beginning at 5:00 p.m. This will be the 21st year that this beloved community-wide celebration has delighted families from across Northeast Indiana. World Baseball Academy (WBA) will be the featured charitable organization, with youth from the WBA participating in both the parade and tree lighting. The tree lighting and brilliant fireworks display is in the heart of the '07 Neighborhood on the Broadway Plaza, in front of the Shine & Hardin building.

"This year, 'Christmas On Broadway' will highlight World Baseball Academy whose mission is to develop leaders who positively impact our world. World Baseball Academy provides an array of atrisk youth mentoring programs that focus on instilling core values into the lives of young people. These core values include being eager to learn, valuing others, recognizing what needs to be done, focusing on the tasks at hand, a commitment to do the right things and adapting and overcoming problems with a positive attitude," said event coordinators, Steve Shine and Tom Hardin of Shine & Hardin, LLP, who originated the holiday celebration 21 years ago.

Caleb Kimmel, CEO of the WBA expressed his gratitude that the mission of the WBA would be spotlighted as part of the annual holiday festivities. "Being featured in an event that attracts families from all over Northeast Indiana helps focus the public's attention on the mission of WBA, which is to develop our next generation of young leaders who have a desire to give back to our community," said Kimmel.

The nationally acclaimed Concordia Lutheran High School Marching Band, under the direction of Band Leader Jennifer Porath, will start the festivities by leading the parade down Broadway, marching to and playing music of the holiday season. The band will be followed by a 1942 antique firetruck that is housed at the Fort Wayne Firefighters Museum, aboard which will be youth from the WBA. Also included in the parade will be proud members of surrounding neighborhood associations including the Broad River Neighborhood Association and the newly rejuvenated Michigan Avenue Neighborhood Association. The parade down Broadway will reach an exciting crescendo with a 10-foot tall, 22-foot long sleigh and reindeer float (uniquely constructed by Mark Gray, owner of Graycraft Signs Fort Wayne), with Santa Claus himself sitting in the "commander's seat." The parade route will begin at Broadway and Creighton and end at the Broadway Plaza, where the magnificent 40-foot Colorado spruce will be lit at 6:00 p.m., to a background of fireworks and Christmas songs.

Upon arrival at the Plaza, Santa Claus and his helpers will be handing out Santa hats, candy canes and mini flashlights and keychains from Deister Machine Company to be given to all of the children in attendance. Santa will also be joined by one of his reindeers, presenting an opportunity for the children to pet his four-legged helper, many of whom will experience greeting a live reindeer for the first time.

Children will also be treated to rides on the all new, exciting miniature train aptly named the Polar Express, which will be located in the east side parking lot adjacent to the Shine & Hardin building. The Polar Express consists of an engine and three passenger cars, a uniformed engineer and conductor and will be decorated for Christmas and playing Christmas music. Also featured will be a train depot where the children can gather before boarding the Polar Express.

Food and beverage trucks will be on-site to make the holiday revelers' visit to the Broadway Plaza even more fun and enticing. A variety of food and beverages will be available to satisfy the tastes of all holiday revelers. The food truck service will be provided by Coterie Pizza, well known in the surrounding area for the preparation of pizza in their master crafted Italian stone oven. The beverage truck will be provided by Travelin' Tom's Coffee Truck, featuring a variety of items including hot specialties such as latte, cappuccino, mocha, hot chocolate and more.

"We are so proud that every sponsor who participated in last year's event has again rejoined us for this year's 21st annual celebration. The family holiday tradition, which is held each year on the Friday before Thanksgiving, will be telecast live on 21Alive beginning at 4:00 p.m., when their entire two hour 30-minute news block will telecast live from the Broadway Plaza. Vice President and General Manager of 21Alive, Chris Fedele, said, "The holiday tradition continues with the wonderful coincidence of this being the 21st year of 'Christmas On Broadway' to be held on the 21st day of November and to be telecast on 21Alive. We are delighted to telecast this family tradition and provide exciting coverage of the event for those who cannot otherwise attend. Family entertainment is what 21Alive is all about and there is nothing more family oriented than beginning the holidays with 'Christmas on Broadway'."

21Alive will be joined as a media sponsor by the City's top-rated cluster of radio stations owned by

Federated Media, including WOWO, 97.3 WMEE, 1380 The Fan, 98.9 The Bear, and K-105. Ben Saurer, General Manager of the Federated stations. stated that, "Again this year 'Christmas On Broadway' will kick off the 78th Annual WOWO Penny Pitch (itself one of the longest and continuous holiday charities in the community) at 3:00 p.m. on November 21st with Casey Hendrickson broadcasting live from the Broadway Plaza. Motorist using Broadway will have the opportunity as they drive by the Broadway Plaza to contribute to the WOWO Penny Pitch by dropping their donation into donation buckets held by the members of the WOWO staff. 2025 is WOWO's 100th anniversary year and we are so pleased to continue to be a part of Fort Wayne traditions, not the least of which is 'Christmas on Broadway'."

The computer center located within the Shine & Hardin building which, during the Spring, Summer and Fall controls the multiple colorized patterns of the Broadway Plaza fountain, will again allow for a variety of lighting display each evening when the tree is lit. The electrical engineering undertaken for the tree and the multi-colored vibrant displays have been designed by Mark Mongold of Kissinger Electric of Columbia City.

The excitement begins this year when Mudrack Tree Service will transport the tree to the Broadway Plaza on November 17th. On that day, Mudrack Tree Service will place the tree into its secure position upon a large tree stand, constructed by CME Construction.


When the tree arrives on Monday, November 17th, its arrival will be telecast live on 21Alive beginning at 5:00 a.m. during 21Alive's Morning News, as well as radio coverage on WOWO, 92.3 FM/1190 AM. Then, throughout the week of November 17th, crews from A Yard Apart will prepare the tree for its lighting, by placing 40,000 lights on the tree, as well as readying the Broadway Plaza for the anticipated thousands of spectators. The entire event site will be overseen and managed through the efforts of the Associated Builders and Contractors Indiana Kentucky Chapter under the supervision of Felisha Anderson, Director of Council Management.


The Broadway Plaza is located at the mid-point of the Broadway Corridor. To the north of the

Broadway Plaza is Fort Wayne's largest redevelopment project in the City's history, that being the nationally acclaimed Electric Works. To the south of the Broadway Plaza is Quimby Village, which is home to the Clyde, Fort Wayne's most unique music venue. The Broadway Corridor is bordered by nine neighborhoods, those being Broad River, Creighton-Home, Historic South Wayne, Historic Oakdale, Fairfield, Illsley Place, Williams-Woodland. West Rudisill Neighborhood Association, and the Michigan Avenue Neighborhood Association.

On Saturday, November 15th, in The Journal Gazette, a full-page outline of the Christmas tree will be available for children of all ages to color their own rendering of the Christmas tree on Broadway. The three top entries will win Visa Gift Cards from Lake City Bank, and prizes from Federated Media and 21Alive. All entries must be received on or before Monday, December 15, 2025, and mailed to WPTA-TV, 3401 Butler Road, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46808. 



If I have heretofore given the impression that every great Christmas event in town is debuting during Night of Lights or even happening during Night of Lights, I apologize. This is not the case.

For example, there is the Fort Wayne Ballet's annual production of "The Nutcracker," which debuts December 5.

Karen Gibbons-Brown, executive and artistic director of ballet, said the redesign of Arts United Center has allowed for the resurrection of the Sugar Plum Parties.

Finally, we have the Blue Jacket Fantasy of Lights.






